- The sense of community, many multi-generational families here



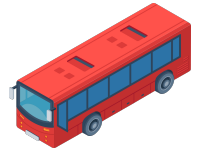
- Diversity and great schools

- Programs for our residents to learn skills with the help of local businesses, because not everyone is able to afford college or want to go to college

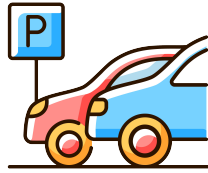


- Better connection w/ the rest of the City

# WHAT IS ONE THING THAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO CHANGE?

- Parking steps away
- The parking on the street
- More handicap parking spaces
- Private driveway/parking spot
- More access to public transportation and benches near current LANTA stops



- Residents don't want to get jobs because of rent increase and inability to pay
- Won't qualify for public housing/voucher if income increases
- What's the incentive for people to want to move up to market rate if the units all look the same?



- How can you ensure mixed income and affordable levels will be maintained over time?
- Concerns about being pushed out - i.e. Townhomes I and II were LIHTC but there seems to be an increase in turnover
- Moving to North or South tips of neighborhood would change peoples' lives drastically (i.e. schools, transportation, etc)



- Don't want to shortchange housing for families in the process of building specialized homes
- Concerns about buildings being built off of the current site
- Example of Hope VI Housing - Hanover Acres redevelopment in Allentown
